I wish I knew...

- All roads in Gainesville are on a grid and you can find a place by its address. Newberry Road/University Ave and Main Street are the 2 main points on the grid. The intersection of University Ave and Main Street is the zero point. Avenues, Places, Roads, and Lanes run east-west; Streets run north-south. Newberry Road/University Avenue separates addresses into North and South. Main Street separates addresses into East and West. Street numbers usually indicate the nearest intersecting road number.
- Arrive with enough money to last you a month because it takes a while to get your student loans and/or your first paycheck
- Never park overtime in a metered space - you'll get way more than one ticket.
- SAAH Jobs Binder: The black binder on top of the student mailboxes contains teaching and other academic job postings.
- Farmer's Market: This is a great Wednesday market downtown near the Hippodrome that sells crafts and fresh fruits, vegetables

CIRCA provides eight computer classrooms and supporting computer lab work areas in five separate facilities for the use of all University of Florida students, faculty, and staff. All eight classrooms are available for [reservation](#) by instructors of UF courses. In order to use CIRCA facilities, you must have a valid [Gatorlink](#) Account. Each lab offers IBM-compatible PCs and/or Macintosh computers, free network printing, and pay-per-page laser printing.

[Architecture 118](#) consists of 25 scanners, four black/white laser printers, one color laser printer, two color plotters, 32 Macintosh computers, 49 IBM-compatible PCs, and six walk-up laptop ports.. There is a Macintosh classroom and an IBM-compatible classroom available for [reservation](#).

[CSE 211](#) consists of 33 scanners, four black/white laser printers, one color laser printer, one color plotter, two Grove line printers, 11 Macintosh computers, and 213 IBM-compatible PCs, and ten walk-up laptop ports. There is an IBM-compatible classroom available for [reservation](#).

[Norman G514](#) consists of 17 scanners, three black/white laser printer, one color laser printer, and 63 Macintosh computers. There are two Macintosh classrooms available for [reservation](#).

[CBD 110](#), otherwise known as Building 105 is a single classroom lab. It has 24 pod units and one instructor station. All are IBM-compatible PC's. There is one black/white laser printer. The classroom is available for [reservation](#)

[Weil 408](#) consists of seven scanners, three black/white laser printer, one color laser printer, and 72 IBM-compatible PCs. There are two IBM-compatible classrooms available for [reservation](#).
