Pursue a Career in Art Education Through the University of Florida's Master of Arts in Art Education Program with Educator Preparation Institute (EPI)

If you have a bachelor's degree in studio art or art history and are interested in becoming an art teacher, the MA in Art Education with Educator Preparation Institute (EPI) is designed for you.

How does it work?

- The MA in Art Education with EPI is a two-year, 39 semester-hour program.
- The aim of this graduate-level program is to provide you with the knowledge and skills you need to become a successful classroom art teacher.

If you are accepted into the program the MA in Art Education with EPI will provide you with:

- Graduate coursework in educational theory and practice through the University of Florida
- Field experiences and an internship in a public school classroom with an experienced art teacher.

What are the requirements?

Applicants must:

- have a bachelor's degree in studio art or art history from an accredited or approved institution, with a minimum of a 3.0 GPA.
- Submit up to ten digital images of personal works of art and a research paper, article, or other sample of academic writing.
- Submit three current letters of recommendation.
- obtain a Statement of Status of Eligibility or a Temporary Teaching Certificate from the [Florida Department of Education](http://wwwfldoe.org).
- pass a background check and meet state fingerprint requirements.
- submit passing scores on the General Knowledge Test and the Art K-12 Subject Test of the FTCE.
