The Collier County Health Department, Immokalee office will hold its 8<sup>th</sup> Annual Migrant Expo on Saturday, March 3<sup>rd</sup> from 10:00a.m. to 2:00p.m. This community event for migrant and seasonal farmworkers and their families is aimed to provide information on health, social and support services as well as educational/vocational opportunities. A group of students from The Florida State University College of Medicine and College of Law, in partnership with the Healthcare Network of Southwest Florida (formerly CHS Healthcare), will participate in the Expo providing outreach, health screenings, and educational information to the Immokalee community. In addition, the Immokalee Arts in Health, an initiative of the Arts in Healthcare for Rural Communities, will host local artist that will display their talents during the event. Some of the performances include singing, poetry, individual and group dances, a Zumba demonstration, and several other pieces performed by local artists, Immokalee students, and other community members.
