SECONDARY CONCENTRATION

One member of the supervisory committee must represent the secondary concentration. Unless indicated otherwise, courses required for the second concentration may not also fulfill specific degree requirements in the area of primary specialization. However, courses in the second concentration may, at the discretion of the student's supervisory committee, be used to fulfill approved elective credit in the primary degree area.
